1. WSPプログラム概要

ワシントンスプリングプログラム(WSP)は、2022年2月に新型コロナウイルス感染症の影響で中止していた留学再開のために立ち上げた新たな留学プログラムであり、全学部全学科の1年生から3年生を参加対象としている。

亜細亜大学アメリカプログラム(AUAP)の留学先であるワシントン州の協定大学に、本学の春季休暇期間(2月から3月)中に約7週間派遣し、生きた英語の習得と異文化を学ぶ本学独自の短期留学プログラムである。

アメリカという多種多様な人々が共生する環境での経験を通じて、 将来多国籍企業等のダイバーシティの場で協働して価値を創出する ことのできる人材の育成を目指す。留学先で履修した科目は卒業要件 の単位として最大4単位が認定される。



2. WSPの目的及び成果

留学先大学での授業や現地学生との交流などを通じて、

- ①参加者の語学力の向上、
- ②日本以外の世界の文化を受容し国際社会で活躍すべく 異文化理解力・受容力の体得、
- ③本学の建学精神である「自助協力」を具現化する学生の主体的な取り組みによる自己の再発見・成長、を目的としている。また、留学経験及び留学前後の本学ならびに留学先大学での学習で醸成される理解力や応用力を総合的に持ち合わすことで、参加学生がグローバル・ビジネスリテラシーを備えた人材に成長することをプログラムの成果としている。



WSP CLASSES

Students have settled into their classes and are making great progress in building their English skills and improving their confidence!

• Career Skills: In this class, students reviewed their visit to the WWU Career & Internship Fair and enjoyed a visit from Sandy, a WWU Career Center staff, who talked about the kinds of skills that U.S. employers are looking for these days. She also explained two different kinds of job skills—"soft" skills and "hard" skills—and reviewed what a "skill set" is. Then she helped students identify their own skill set. Students also took a tour of WWU's Career Center which included a presentation introducing them to the Career Center's resources and services. Finally, students reviewed their experiences with the WWU Career Center tour, as well as with meeting Sandy and her colleagues.





 English Communication Skills: Students have been working on various fluency activities and have done several practice interviews in class which prepared them to interview native speakers for homework. For their pronunciation work, students have been working on minimal pairs focusing on the s, sh, and th sounds. In addition, they are writing weekly journals and correcting common errors that teacher Jon has highlighted. Finally, students watched a documentary about a Buddhist monk and then crafted a written summary and reaction to it.



• Beautiful Bellingham: Students enjoyed a class visit from the WWU Police Department. The visiting officers discussed how to stay safe in Bellingham as well as talked about their jobs as police officers. The students prepared for an outing by role playing restaurant conversations and then visited Boulevard Park by bus and walked from the park to Fairhaven. Finally, the students visited a local elementary school for a day. This opportunity offered a lot of cultural exchange between our students and the 2nd graders!

• Experience Class: Students have been learning more about Western and how to get around the area on public transportation. 

WSP CLASSES

• Career Skills: Students listened to a presentation by Abby Senuty, a WWU career counselor, about job interviews in the U.S. They also listened to three different answers to a series of typical job interview questions (on the Planitplus website) and chose the one they thought was best. This helped students to review strategies for answering job interview questions. Students also started working on a project with the following steps: they chose a career that they are interested in (they went through a long list of careers); using an example of a simple job posting, they wrote a job posting for a job that they would like to apply for; then, using a template that teacher Tom gave them, they wrote a resume that they would use to apply for that job; then they prepared for a mock job interview with teacher Tom on Zoom. Finally, to practice listening, students watched short clips from video recordings of interviews that teacher Tom did with Americans in which they talk







• English Communication Skills: Students continued working on various fluency activities and have completed additional practice interviews in class to prepare for their second visit with Western students who study Japanese and their second visit to Bellingham High School to meet students who also study Japanese. In addition, they are continuing to write weekly journals and correcting common errors with teacher Jon's help. Finally, students have worked on pronunciation, for example, minimal pairs L vs R, sh vs s vs th, and iy vs I.





WSP CLASSES

Career Skills: Students did a vocabulary review activity where they were given a word list, then they listened to WWU students explain one of the words on the list without saying which word it was. Then the WSP students had to guess the word. Students also completed a mock job interview on Zoom with the instructor. In the interviews, the instructor asked questions that were very similar to job interview questions they had been working on in class. Students chose the job they were applying for and used the resume they wrote to answer the instructor's questions. Following the mock job interviews, students were also given time in a computer lab to work on PowerPoint slides that they used to give their final presentations about why they should get the job they applied for in the job interview. Finally, Kerry Allen came into class and talked about her experiences of working in both Japan and the US. The purpose was to explore the differences and similarities between workplaces in the two countries.



English Communication Skills: Students wrote a conversation between a native speaker and a Japanese student. They submitted it to the teacher who corrected it, and they memorized the conversation. For their final test they performed the conversation for their teacher.



Beautiful Bellingham: During their final week of classes, teacher Jon led students on a nature walk up through Sehome Hill Arboretum, which ended with a climb up an observation tower and donuts! Then in the last class, students did speaking activities that allowed them to reflect on their seven weeks of experiences at WWU, in Bellingham, and in the greater Pacific Northwest region.
